

WHO LEADS SOLVING HOMELESSNESS IN UTAH?

The Utah Homeless Network (UHN) is a robust network of statewide homeless systems advocates and service providers who collaborate to make homelessness rare, brief, and non-recurring.

WHAT IS WORKING?

- Collaboration between local and state homelessness leadership fosters accountability for agencies receiving state and federal funding.
- We utilize an aligned approach to addressing homelessness statewide, including best practices and evaluating performance standards.
- Data shows 80-95% of individuals placed in housing with appropriate supportive services are still in their homes two years later.

WHAT DO WE NEED?

The UHN established a statewide weekly COVID-19 collaborative call as a forum to solve problems with access to testing, vaccination planning, and emergency planning. This body also allocates state and federal funding, establishes best practices, and holds agencies accountable by evaluating performance measures for funded projects.
